### **About the event**

The activist past of the San Francisco Bay Area offers a legacy of anti-imperialist feminism that remains salient for today's social movements. For fifty years and more, the Bay Area has been home to feminist and queer movements as they interact with antiracist, anti-militarist, abolitionist, and internationalist politics that continue to affect social movements today.

Then we move inside, where a roundtable of exemplary leaders from historical activist projects will discuss relationships between past and present movements.
